At Rosedale Primary School, we aim to create a relaxed, secure, and supportive environment to enable all children to thrive. We have a highly committed and energetic team who are looking forward to working with you to provide the best possible learning opportunities for your child.

At Rosedale Primary School, we provide a comprehensive transition to school program that helps our incoming prep students build familiarity with our staff and the school environment and understanding of school routines. We believe that this helps to reduce anxiety and promote feelings of security and positivity toward attending school.

Should you choose Rosedale Primary School as the educational setting for your child, you will be provided with opportunities to engage with our dedicated staff well before your child commences school:

- In Term Two, students tour the school and experience the opportunity to play on the playgrounds and read and play in the library:
- In Term Three, students work with different teachers to experience lessons in different classes and parts of the school:
- In Term Four, enrolled students spend four sessions in the Prep classroom with our Prep teacher and Education Support staff member:
- In Term Four, we also schedule Parent-Teacher interviews between our incoming parents, our Prep teacher Barbara Campion, Rosedale Kindergarten Educator Pauline Dent. This enables us to build a thorough understanding of your child's academic and wellbeing needs. It also provides you with an opportunity to share your child's strengths, challenges and interests.

Rosedale Primary commences on Wednesday 27th January. Students return on Thursday 28th January. Prep students do not attend on Wednesdays for the month of February. Prep students begin full time from Monday, 1st March.

On day 1 we encourage you to bring your child to the classroom and help them unpack their bag, settle in to class. At the conclusion of the school day, please wait in the passage outside Room 1, and upon the closing bell at 3:15 pm collect your child from the classroom. Beyond that we encourage our students to become independent and responsible learners. They will depart, in lines, via Cricket Street or Moore Street entrances.

School crossings are located on Cricket and Moore Streets. Parking is available on Cricket Street. The loading zone outside the office is used only for drop off and pick up. Please don't leave vehicles there unattended. The school zone is a permanent 40 km zone and is policed.

School Facilities and Programs

Specialists

Rosedale Primary are currently running some incredible Specialist programs.

Before and After School Care

The Rosedale Primary Out of School Hours Care is run from Room 5. Students can attend from 7:00am until the school bell goes. Here, they can access breakfast and some time to settle into the school day. After school, students can attend from 3.15–6:00pm. They will receive an afternoon snack and lots of time to interact with their peers.

Breakfast Club

Rosedale Primary supports families by offering our students free access to breakfast on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings. Students are offered things like cereal, toast, baked beans and fruit. Students should arrive at 8.15 am to eat before they enter their classroom. This is operated out of Room 8.

Assemblies

Assemblies run every Friday at 2:45 pm. Parents are welcome to attend. This is where students receive awards, birthdays are celebrated and events are talked about. It has a wonderful community vibe so please come along.



How You Can Help

As the first day of school approaches, it is essential to prepare our children for the challenges ahead by talking through and modelling ways of working through and solving these developmental milestones.

Physical Development:

- Feed themselves
- Undo/open their lunchbox
- Remove and insert a straw in a drink box
- Get a drink from a school tap
- Pack and unpack their school bag
- Go to the toilet by themselves, undo and do zips and buttons, tuck in clothing
- Use a urinal
- Manage the taps
- Unwrap food
- Remove/replace a drink container lid
- Drink from a straw
- Peel a piece of fruit
- Flush the toilet
- Wash their hands

While accidents can happen at this age, teachers try to prevent these by regular visits to the toilets during the first few weeks of school. A change of clothes for school, placed in the bottom of your child's school bag, is encouraged.

Dressing

Sometimes children feel too hot or too cold so they must be able to cope with their school clothes by themselves. The best way to help children is to encourage them to dress themselves. If they get stuck, encourage them to ask for help.

Nose Blowing

It is important for health that children are aware when their noses need wiping or blowing and that they are able to do so themselves. The care of personal handkerchiefs and the correct disposal of tissues are also important steps to good health and independence.

Social Development

Primary school is a wonderful place for students to interact with children and adults older and younger than themselves. They develop the skills to help them to cope with the social aspects of life. Children learn to share, take turns, respect and listen to others and cooperate. Children often work in groups in school to develop these social skills. They need the same skills in the playground.

You can develop your child's social skills by:

- Taking them to playgroups/playgrounds
- Role modelling interacting with others when things aren't going their way e.g., someone is holding more than their share of toys.
- Practise asking for help when they need it.
- Modelling how to seek out friendships.
- Look for social stories at the library when you visit.

Enrolment

Our school uses the Department of Education's secure digital enrolment system called VicStudents. This means you can submit your Foundation (Prep) application online and receive updates through the system. If you have any questions about the online enrolment process, please contact our school.

A Prep School Bag

A school bag- Place a big-name tag on the outside so your child can easily identify their bag

- A lunchbox (make sure it is easy to open and can hold enough food for a long day)
- Fruit Snack- e.g., strawberries, apple, mango, banana etc.
- Snack- muesli bar, fruit, biscuits, cheese, yoghurt, sultanas
- Lunch- A sandwich, rice and vegetables, pasta, sushi etc.
- Please make sure your child's lunch box contains not only energy inducing foods, but also foods they like
- A refillable water bottle. Please send your child to school with water only
- School sunhat
- An Art Smock
- RPS reader bag
- Spare underwear and socks in a named zip lock bag
- Library bag

Key things to note

- We encourage you to login to Compass daily as this is our primary means of communication
- If consent / payment for excursions and incursions is not completed by the 'due date', your child will be unable to participate/attend.
- Full Day Absences MUST be reported via Compass on the day of absence (early in the morning or before 10am, to avoid absence notification)
- Students arriving to school after 9.00am or leaving during school hours MUST be signed in/out by a parent/carer via the Kiosk at the Office
- Students must NOT be left alone in the school grounds before 8.30am or after 3.30pm as the yard is unsupervised during this time
- Parents and students are NOT permitted to walk through staff car parks OR use them for parking.
- Riding of scooters, bikes, skateboards etc., is NOT permitted in the school grounds at drop-off or pick-up (school and non-school children).

Communication

Communication is important to us. We encourage families and students to keep in touch as things arise so we may work together to resolve difficulties. We hold two Parent/Teacher Conferences a year, and communicate regularly through our Newsletter, through emails and messages and through Compass, our school operating program.

Compass

When your child starts school you will be given a password and login details to access Compass. Through the parent portal you can view your child's information and achievements, provide consent and payment for excursions, incursions and camps, manage and view your child's attendance, receive semester reports and many other day to day organisational details.

Contact Details

It is important the school has accurate and up to date contact details for everyone involved in your child's education. Mobile phone numbers and email addresses are vital so we can contact you quickly if required. Emergency contacts also require up to date contact details so we can get in touch if you are unavailable. These details are included in your enrolment form, but it's vital to remember that any changes need to be updated at the school office.

Privacy

Also included in the enrolment forms are permissions for various school requirements. One of these is the privacy requirement. This gives you control over your child's privacy in print and media. We celebrate our students in our newsletter, around the school, on our website and our social media page. Please complete the privacy permissions so we know where best to showcase your child's achievements.

Meetings

In addition to the Parent/Teacher conferences twice a year, our staff are always happy to speak with parents regarding their students. As teachers are often busy in class educating their charges, we ask that you try to ring and organise meetings in advance for times that will not impact on your child's learning. Student Support Group Meetings are held as necessary to deal with needs and requirements as they arise.

An Outside School Hours Care program (OSHC) has been operating intermittently since 2017. This is the second year the service is operated by Rosedale Primary School Council and directed by Administrator, Kirstie Batty. Rosedale Primary recognised the need to provide assistance for working families.

The program endeavours to replicate the opportunities for relaxation, leisure, security and protection, which parents provide for their children at home.

RPS OSHC Handbooks are available from the school office.

Hours of Operation

Before School Care: 7.00 am – 8.45 am

After School Care: 3.15 pm – 6.00 pm

When classes finish early (on the last school day of each Term), the Program commences at the earlier time to accommodate parents' requirements.

Fee Structure

Before School Care (includes breakfast) \$30.46

After School Care (includes afternoon tea) \$34.74

Substantial subsidies are available to most families.

- Non-cancellation of booking: Full session fee applies, as the program is staffed based on the anticipated bookings for that session.
- Notification of fee changes will be made in writing to the OSHC families.
- Fees are charged for the whole session booked regardless of the number of hours used and for absences where no cancellation has been received. Fees are subject to change depending on economic factors. Further details of Fee Policy are available in the OSHC Policy Manual in the OSHC Office.
