Dear parents and carers,

In Term 4, 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for education-related costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks.

The School Saving Bonus is not available for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

Actions for parents and carers

Before 18 October 2024, the Department of Education is asking parents and carers to:

- Complete enrolment: If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025. For more information, read about Enrolling in School.

- Check your contact information: Ensure your email address and phone number is up to date with us. You can check this information by contacting us directly.

We need to ensure your contact information is up to date as the Department of Education will email you twice:

- in October, to verify your email address

- in November, with your \$400 School Saving Bonus.



The Magpies are Coming! The Magpies are Coming!!

Magpies are swooping at Rosedale Primary.

They have been active on the oval, and have been reported by students riding to school.

Interesting fact: It's true, magpies remember your face. They have excellent recall for faces and very long memories. So, if you've been swooped before, or even if you just look like someone they swooped last year, you're likely to get the same treatment again.

How to avoid getting swooped

1 – Give magpies a wide berth

Magpies often live and nest in the same area their entire lives and tend to defend the territory within 50 to 100 metres of their nest. If you're out and about on your bike, walking your dog or going for a jog, the best way to avoid being swooped is to change your route for the breeding season which lasts 6 to 8 weeks.

2 – Don't run….or stop

If you are swooped on, don't run or fight back. If you're on a bike, get off it. Stay calm and walk quickly through the area.

3 – Protect your head

Magpies usually swoop from behind and will just clear your head. Some will strike the top of your head with their wings, beak or claws so try to protect your head and eyes by wearing a wide brimmed hat and glasses or walk with an open umbrella above your head.

4 – Walk with friends

Walk or ride in groups, as swooping birds usually only target individuals. You can also place a sign nearby to warn others or let your local council know so they can install a sign for the period.

5 – Keep your cool

Do not act aggressively. If you wave your arms about or shout, the magpies will see you as a threat to the nest – and they can recognise your face and have very long memories!

The survey will be conducted online and only takes 20 minutes to complete. It can be completed on any internet enabled device (desktop computer, laptop, tablet or smartphone) and is compatible with most browsers.

The survey is available in English and 10 other languages. If you require assistance in another language, resources may be available for you. Please reach out to your child's teacher, or the school if you require assistance in another language.

The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey has been extended to Friday 20th September 2024.

PLEASE NOTE: Only one parent / caregiver / guardian from each household is invited to complete the survey on behalf of the student's family. Please reach out to your child's teacher, or the school if your child's family lives in two separate households, so both households can have the opportunity to provide their feedback.
